YANKTON SIOUX TRIBE RESOLUTION NO. 2014-005

WHEREAS: The Yankton Sioux Tribe is an unincorporated Tribe of Indians that is not

subject to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and

WHEREAS: The Yankton Sioux Tribe is an unincorporated Tribe of Indians operating under

an amended Constitution and By Laws approved on April 24, 1963; June 16, 1975

and March 23, 1990; and

WHEREAS: The Yankton Sioux Tribe's Business and Claims Committee is the elected body

constituted for the purpose of conducting the Business of and serving the best

interest of the Yankton Sioux Tribe; and

WHEREAS: The Yankton Sioux Tribe's Business and Claims Committee has contributed

throughout the years to improving the standard quality of life on the Yankton

Sioux Reservation; and

WHEREAS: Leonard Peltier, in upholding Indigenous goals—those of securing and

protecting the rights of American Indians of First Nations—was wrongfully convicted of murder for the June 26, 1975, deaths of two agents of the Federal

Bureau of Investigation; and

WHEREAS: Leonard Peltier has nevertheless served more than 30 years in prison since his

arrest on February 6, 1976; and

WHEREAS: although Leonard Peltier maintains that he did not kill the agents, he has openly

expressed remorse and sadness over their deaths; and

WHEREAS: Leonard Peltier has no prior convictions and has advocated for non-violence

throughout his prison term, has been a model prisoner, and has received

excellent evaluations from his work supervisors on a regular basis; and

WHERAS: Leonard Peltier is now over 60 years of age—a great grandfather—and suffers

from partial blindness, diabetes, a heart condition, and high blood pressure and

now faces other emergency health issues; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Yankton Sioux Tribe's Business and Claims Committee supports ending or better negotiating the immediate release of Leonard Peltier and requests that he be brought back for incarceration on the Turtle Mountain Indian Reservation, with stipulations to be worked out with all agencies involved.

BE IT EVEN FURTHER RESOLVED, that Robert Flying Hawk, Chairman and Glenford "Sam" Sully, Secretary of the Yankton Sioux Tribe's Business and Claims Committee are hereby authorized to execute documents on behalf of the Yankton Sioux Tribe.
