Re memo of SA MICHAEL A. RIGNEY dated 8/28/75 (Serial H-20-73).

On 9/2/75, MARTY ROAN EAGLE was located at House 578, Oglala, South Dakota. ROAN EAGLE confirmed his arrest at Chadron, Nebraska, on 7/25/75, in possession of a cartridge, but denied knowledge of the type of cartridge or the type of weapon in which it is used. He said he found the cartridge on the road in front of his mother's house in rural Oglala, South Dakota.

ROAN EAGLE was further interviewed concerning RESMURS at which time he said he was at the residence of MAURICE YELLOW HORSE in Slim Buttes, South Dakota, on the day of the shooting and did not learn of the shooting until he traveled to Oglala, South Dakota, and saw jeeps and activity in the area. He said he was with MAURICE YELLOW HORSE on the day the Agents were murdered and added that MAURICE YELLOW HORSE is his cousin and is not known, by the name MIKE YELLOW HORSE. He said he knows of a person by the name of VERDELL (Phonetic) YELLOW HORSE, who resides on Red Shirt Table and who he thinks has a middle name of MIKE. He knows of no other MIKE YELLOW HORSE and does not know a MIKE ANDERSON. The names of JOHN BOYSE, DAVID MANY HORSES, DAVID HER MANY HORSES, AND DAVID MANY HORNS were not familiar to him.

He said the only information he has heard concerning the shooting incident was in a conversation he had with a LAWRENCE LONE WOLF, Oglala, South Dakota, wherein LONE WOLF told him that the Bureau Agents were in the area talking to a girl, and when the girl was unresponsive to the Agents, one of the Agents "backhanded" the girl and it was at this point that the shooting occurred. He felt LONE WOLF did mot have firsthand knowledge of the incident, and recalls that LONE WOLF

On this date, GAYLA TWISS, House Number 41, Northridge Housing, Pine Ridge, South Dakota, was contacted at her place of employment, the Mental Health Department, Pine Ridge Community Hospital. She was apprised of the identity of the interviewing Agent and advised She was being interviewed in regard to her observations in the Vicinity of JUMPING BULL Hall on the afternoon of June 26, 1975. Thereafter, she provided the following information:

At approximately 3:00 p.m. on June 26, 1975, she and CLEO MARSHALL, a psycological technician at Pine Ridge Hospital departed Pine Ridge for Oglala, South Dakota for the purpose of making a house visit in that area. Upon reaching the vicinity of the GENE LENIHAN residence, they observed numerous law enforcement cars block!ng Highway 18. As it was evident they were not going to he able to proceed past that point, they pulled over to the side of the road to see what was happening. They subsequently learned that there had been a shooting at JUMPING BULL Hall and that law enforcement officers were pursuing people in the hills to the west, of JUMPING BULL'S residence. TWISS stated at no time did she see anyone who was alleged to have been involved in the shootin incident and had no idea as to who was involved in the matter. TWISS advised she departed the scene at approximately 4:15 p.m. and noted that before leaving, at about 4:00 p.m., she heard shooting in the hills behind JUMPING BULL Hall.



PHYLLIS KRAUSE, nee BRAVE HEART, 1730 North 7th Street, Apartment 6F, subsequent to the identification of the interviewing agents furnished the following information:

KRAUSE advised on June 26, 1975, a Thursday, she was not in Oglala, South Dakota. KRAUSE continued and stated that she was not on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation on June 26, 1975, the day agents of the FBI were shot and killed.

According to KRAUSE the last time she was on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation was between February 29 and March 1, 1975 which was the time that her late husband LEON KRAUSE was alive.

According to KRAUSE, she is not acquainted or does she know ELI LITTLE SPOTTED HORSE. In addition, KRAUSE stated that she does not know FRANCIS GOOD BUFFALO, JOE ROBERTS, DAVID SKY, and an individual using the name SNAG.

Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota.

ROBERT BECK and WILLIAM MC CLOSKY badly beaten by a large group of individuals for a period of three hours. MC CLOSKY hospitalized with broken back, jaw and related injuries.

LEONARD CROW DOG, AL RUNNING, FRANK RUNNING, GERALD MILLARD, OWEN JEFFERSON YOUNG, JR. and DIANE RUNNING identified as individuals who participated in the beatings.

On 9/4/75, Assistant U.S. Attorney, Sioux Falls, South Dakota authorized prosecution of LEONARD CROW DOG, GERALD MILLARD, OWEN JEFFERSON YOUNG, JR., AL RUNNING and FRANK RUNNING for violation of Title 18, U.S. Code, Section 1153 and South Dakota Compiled Laws 22-18-11. On 9/4/75, complaints filed and warrants issued. Search warrants also issued for residences of LEONARD CROW DOG and AL RUNNING, Grass Mountain area. Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota.

On 9/5/75, warrants executed by Bureau Agents at residences of LEONARD CROW DOG and AL RUNNING. LEONARD CROW DOG, GERALD MILLARD, OWEN JEFFERSON YOUNG, JR., AL RUNNING and FRANK RUNNING were apprehended and large quantities of guns, ammunition, grenades, dynamite and other explosives recovered.

Re memorandum to SAC, 9/4/75 (serial 2282).

Investigation of this matter within the Aberdeen Resident Agency revealed that the pricing number in the code of Coast-to-Coast Store, that is, 2B10N, would indicate a pricing zone as well as a price. The letter B indicates that the store is west of the Missouri River while the letter A in the pricing code depicts a store that is closer to the main warehouse at Minneapolis. It would indicate therefore, that in connection with the leads set forth in referenced memorandum, that these shells which we are attempting to identify came from two different stores as the stores themselves are designated as either a A Store or a B Store, depending upon their location. The only exception to this is the store at Mobridge, which is an A Store for most items; however, it is a B Store for ammunition.
