PROSECUTIVE SUMMARY REPORT

I: NARRATIVE OF OFFENSE

On June 25, 1975, and June 26, 1975, Special Agents (SAs) RONALD A. WILLIAMS and JACK R. COLER were investigating Minneapolis case entitled "JAMES THEODORE EAGLE, also known as (aka) Jimmy Eagle - Fugitive; ROBERT KENNETH HORSE - Fugitive; HERMAN THUNDER HAWK - Fugitive; THEODORE PAUL POURIER, aka Teddy Paul Pourier; JERRY ORVILLE SCHWARTING - Victim; ROBERT LESLEY DUNSMORE, aka Bob Dunsmore - Victim."

On the morning of June 26, 1975, SAs COLER and WILLIAMS informed fellow Special Agents and members of the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Police Department, Pine Ridge, South Dakota, they were going to Oglala, South Dakota, which is located within the confines of the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, in an attempt to locate JAMES THEODORE EAGLE. At approximately 11:50 a.m., Special Agents reported they were under gunfire. Special Agents later were found dead of gunshot wounds in the vicinity of JUMPING BULL Hall located four miles south of Oglala, South Dakota.

II. NAME OF DEFENDANTS

HARRY JUMPING BULL is described as an Indian male approximately 74 years old and CECELIA JUMPING BULL is described as an Indian female, date of birth September 18, 1902.

III. DATE AND PLACE WHERE ACTS ALLEGEDLY COMMITTED .

On June 27, 1975, CECELIA JUMPING BULL advised she and her husband, HARRY, are owners of property known as the JUMPING BULL residence, Oglala, South Dakota. CECELIA JUMPING BULL advised that prior to June 26, 1975, she rented a campground located in a grove of trees near the river to a number of Indians for \$60 per month.

On July 12, 1975, HARRY and CECELIA JUMPING BULL were served with a subpoena to appear on July 14, 1975, before the Federal Grand Jury, Rapid City, South Dakota. The U.S. Attorney's Office, Rapid City, advised that neither HARRY nor CECELIA JUMPING BILL reported or appeared before the Federal Grand Jury on July 14, 1975, after being called to testify.

MICHAEL JOHN CLIFFORD located at 1822 Polly Street, Flint, Michigan, on July 31, 1975, advised that he and JAMES EAGLE, WALLACE LITTLE, JR., MELVIN LEE HOUSTON, WANDA SIERS and JOHN NELSON all resided in the vicinity of HARRY JUMPING BULL'S Hall until June 8, 1975, at which time he departed the reservation,

LEONARD CROW DOG, Date of birth August 18, 1942, residence CROW DOG's Paradise, Grass Mountain Area, Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota, was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and of the purpose of the interview. CROW DOG was advised of certain of his constitutional rights as set forth in Bureau form entitled, "Interrogation; Advice of Rights," which were read aloud to him by Special Agent PERRIN. CROW DOG stated he understood his rights and signed the Advice of Rights Waiver form. CROW DOG provided the following information regarding his activities on the night of September 2, 1975, and early morning of September 3, 1975.

CROW DOG advised that he had been preparing for an Indian ceremony on the night of September 2, 1975, and came from the sweat bath located on CROW DOG's Paradise at approximately 11:30 p.m. He stated they had a small feast and ceremony where Jerked meat was eaten and certain other Indian rites were performed. CROW DOG then advised he went to bed at approximately 12:00 or 12:30 a.m. At approximately 1:30 a.m., he was summoned by individuals at his paradise and told that BILL MC CLOSKY had come to see him. CROW DOG stated that when he came out of his house he saw that MC CLOSKY was already parked in the yard and heard MC CLOSKY making threats against him. He advised he approached the car and observed BILL MC CLOSKY, ROBERT BECK and their wives in MC CLOSKY's vehicle. He stated he did not say anything to MC CLOSKY or BECK personally. but told his boys to take care of them.

CROW DOG stated he went back to sleep at approximately 2:00 a.m., and did not hear any commotion or noise during the rest of the night. He stated he was not involved in the fight which supposedly took place on his property and was not aware of any such altercation. CROW DOG stated that he could not recall all individuals who were staying at his residence that night but did provide the names of the following individuals who were there:

JOE CHASING HORSE
ROCKY CHASING HORSE
HENRY CROW DOG

LEONARD CROW DOG advised that there were numerous other individuals there but he could not recall who they were.

CROW DOG would provide no additional information after this point.

HENRY CROW DOG was interviewed at the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Office located on the Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota, by Special Agents LYNN J. PERRIN and GREGORY J. HOESCHEN. He was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and of the purpose of the interview, CROW DOG was advised of certain constitutional rights as set forth in Bureau form entitled, "Interrogation; Advice of Rights," which he read, stated he understood, but would not sign. CROW DOG provided the following information.

HENRY CROW DOG advised that late in the evening of September 2, 1975, there had been a small ceremony and feast at CROW DOG's Paradise and that he had gone to bed sometime after midnight. He advised that at approximately 1:30 a.m., BOB BECK and BILL MC CLOSKY drove into the driveway at CROW DOG's Paradise, CROW DOG stated he knew that they had been drinking by the way they were acting and heard them shout that they wanted to talk to CROW DOG. At that point, HENRY CROW DOG approached the car and observed MC CLOSKY get out of the car. BECK was also taken out of the car and the vehicle was searched for weapons. During the search of the vehicle conducted by HENRY CROW DOG and several other Indians who were staying at CROW DOG's Paradise that night, a fairly large quantity of beer was removed from the car. Also two empty beer cans were removed. CROW DOG stated he questioned MC CLOSKY and BECK about the death of ANDREW STEWART which had occurred near CROW DOG's Paradise approximately one month earlier. CROW DOG could not recall a fight taking place between BECK, MC CLOSKY and the other individuals located at CROW DOG's Paradise. He advised they left his residence sometime after 3:00 a.m., on September 3, 1975.

CHASING HORSE stated he understood his rights, agreed to discuss the matter, and executed the advice of rights form,

CHASING HORSE stated that he was present at LEONARD CROW DOG's residence on the night of September 2, 1975. He continued that he was aware that a man named BECK and another person, along with some women and children, entered the gate to CROW DOG's at approximately 1:30 a.m. on September 5, 1975. CHASING HORSE added that he overheard a conversation between the man he did not know and MIKE BIG WATER, gate guard, in which this man wanted to see LEONARD CROW DOG or HENRY CROW DOG. CHASING HORSE stated that this person wanted to see LEONARD or HENRY to discuss a fight that had occurred between these individuals and FRANK RUNNING earlier in the evening in Cedar Butte, South Dakota.

CHASING HORSE then stated that MIKE BIG WATER told these individuals that LEONARD CROW DOG's residence was "sacred ground", and they were not allowed there because they were drinking. CHASING HORSE then stated that HENRY CROW DOG approached the car and told BECK and the other person to get out of the car whereupon the unknown individual threw a beer can out the window.

CHASING HORSE stated the individuals then got out of the car and the women and children were taken to LEONARD CROW DOG's house, while the men stayed by the car.

CHASING HORSE stated he then decided that HENRY CROW DOG could take care of the situation and that he (CHASING HORSE) went back to his tent and went to sleep. CHASING HORSE added that he watched this activity from a distance of approximately 50 feet. CHASING HORSE added he did not see anyone get hit or kicked.

MICHAEL BIG WATER, residence CROW DOG's Paradise, Grass Mountain Area, Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota, was interviewed at the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Office located on the Rosebud Indian Reservation, South Dakota, by Special Agents LYNN JAY PERRIN and GREGORY J. HOESCHEN. He was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents and of the purpose of the interview. BIG WATER was advised of certain constitutional rights as set forth in Bureau form entitled, "Interrogation; Advice of Rights," which he read, stated he understood and signed the Advice of Rights Waiver form. BIG WATER provided the following information:

BIG WATER stated he was the gate sentry at CROW DOG's Paradise, on the night of September 2, 1975, and early morning of September 5, 1975. He advised that at approximately 1:00 a.m., he observed a car which he knew to belong to BILL MC CLOSKY coming through the front gate of CROW DOG's Paradise. He advised he approached the car and asked them to get out. BECK informed BIG WATER that he wanted to talk to CROW DOG and asked him to call CROW DOG to the gate. BIG WATER stated he then searched the car and found approximately one case of beer and a bullet clip containing live rounds of ammunition which he took from the car.

When asked as to whether or not a fight had occurred between BECK and MC CLOSKY and the Indians staying at CROW DOG's Paradise that night, BIG WATER stated he could not recall any such fight happening. BIG WATER gave the following names of individuals who were staying at CROW DOG's Paradise on the night in question:

JOE CHASING HORSE
ROCKY CHASING HORSE
GERALD "COKE" MILLARD

BIG WATER stated although he was the sentry at CROW DOG's that night, he was not carrying a gun. He stated he has been shot at numerous times in the past and upon being shot at, generally lays down on the ground.

It was noted that BIG WATER was wearing a pair of brown leather cowboy boots which were extremely worn out and cracked along the sole of the boot.

MARY JANE CARROLL (RN), Staff Nurse, Regional East Hospital, Rapid City, South Dakota, who was aware of the identities of contacting Agents, provided the following information regarding WILLIAM MC CLOSKEY who was admitted to this hospital on September 3, 1975, and is currently assigned, to room 427.

Preliminary examination of MC CLOSKEY reveals that he has multiple contusions, a laceration above the right hip, compression fractures of vertebrae numbers 14, T5, and T6, possible fracture of Transverse Process of L1, possible fractures of ribs 7 and 8, fractured mandible, and internal injuries. CARROLL advised that more extensive tests and examinations would have to be made at a later time in the very near future; however, due to MC CLOSKEY's condition at this time the exact extent of MC CLOSKEY's injuries cannot be fully determined.

V. ARREST OF GERALD MILLARD

On September 5, 1975, at approximately 6:45 a.m. at a location known as LEONARD CROW DOG's residence near Rosebud, South Dakota, Special Agents GEORGE D. HAFNER, FREDERICK COWARD, JR. and EDMUND DIEM, pursuant to a Federal search warrant for the premises of the CROW DOG residence, conducted a search.

At one point during the search a tent located in the area northeast of the premises was approached by the above Special Agents. Subsequent to an appropriate announcement of identification, an Indian female exited the above tent with a baby. Special Agent (SA) COWARD inquired if there were any other occupants in the tent to which this Indian female replied in the affirmative. Thereafter an Indian male, in his twenties, wearing glasses, exited the tent.

Above Indian male was asked to identify himself to which he replied "I want to see my attorney". Subsequently above Indian male was identified as GERALD MILLARD by other Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and placed under arrest by those Agents.

Thereafter MILLARD was placed in a Bureau vehicle, advised, of his rights by SA DIEM as set forth on the "Interrogation; Advice of Rights" form. He stated he understood his rights and refused to sign the form. He advised that he wished to contact an attorney as soon as possible. He was subsequently transported to the Pierre, South Dakota, Resident Agency by SA COWARD and SA DIEM.

After obtaining brief background and description as set forth below, MILLARD was transported to the Hughes County Jail, Pierre, South Dakota, where he was photographed, fingerprinted and incarcerated.

VI. INTERVIEW OF ESTES JOSEPH STEWART

ESTES JOSEPH STEWART who resides in an orange colored house approximately one quarter mile south of AL RUNNING'S residence, was interviewed concerning his knowledge of the events of the assault of WILLIAM MC CLOSKY at CROW DOG's Paradise. STEWART was advised of the official identity of SA GROVE by display of his credentials and of NORMAN L. BEAR, Criminal Investigator, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), who was present during the interview.

STEWART advised to the best of his recollection on Sunday night at approximately 2:45 a.m. he was awakened at his residence by an unknown Indian male who was approximately 35-45 years of age. who told him that something was going on down at CROW DOG's. STEWART said he got up and drove his 1964 Plymouth to CROW DOG's house and as he was entering CROW DOG's Paradise, he saw some men, possibly two or three, pushing what he believed to be an older model blue Ford car. He said they were pushing the car from CROW DOG's Paradise up the lane to the hard surface road. He said apparently the car would not start as the battery was weak. He further said he believed the car belonged to one of the MC CLOSKEYs or to the BECKs, He said he knows that the MC CLOSKY who drives this car is a young man who wears glasses.

STEWART said he went into CROW DOG's Paradise and looked around and went into LEONARD CROW DOG's house. He said in LEONARD'S house were three girls and three boys who were drinking, coffee. He said he was unable to identify any of those in CROW DOG's. He said while in CROW DOG's house, he never noticed anything unusual, nor did he see any blood or signs of a fight.

STEWART stated he recalled upon seeing the car which was leaving CROW DOG's that the young MC CLOSKY wearing glasses was sitting in the front seat on the driver's side and one of the BECK boys was sitting in the passenger side of the front seat. He said in the back seat were two women who each had a small child.

BIG WATER advised that he had been living at Crow Dog's Paradise at the Rosebud Indian Reservation for approximately two months and prior to that he was in Iowa for the trial of LEONARD CROW DOG. He said he was originally from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and was visiting friends at Crow Dog's at the present time.

Located on BIG WATER'S person was a letter dated August 26, 1975, from JACANN PIPER, P.O. Box 178, Pine Ridge, South Dakota. Also located was a card bearing the name and address GERRI MANN, 395 Home Street, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada. In addition, there were, two identification cards from the American Indian Movement (AIM), Rosebud Chapter, one identifying MICHAEL BIG WATER as a member and the other one signed BILL MEANS, Secretary.

BIG WATER claimed that he was not involved in any criminal activity and denied any knowledge of the killing of two FBI Agents on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in June, 1975.

After furnishing the following background information, BIG WATER became uncooperative and declined to furnish any additional information.

These three individuals were temporarily detained at the location where they were stopped in order to allow the arresting party to affect the arrest of LEONARD CROW DOG. These three individuals were instructed to return to St. Francis and were observed getting into KILLS IN WATER's automobile.

At approximately 6:50 AM the above three individuals appeared at the south roadblock near the residence of AL RUNNING. The individuals were stopped and upon exiting their vehicle became extremely boisterous, out-spoken, and making derogatory remarks to the Agents at the south roadblock.

SA DONALD G. WILEY requested a Bureau of Indian Affairs Police Unit to which request Agency Special Officer RICHARD COLHOFF responded. Upon COLHOFF's arrival at the south roadblock, the three Indian male individuals became boisterous, loud and making derogatory remarks to COLHOFF at which time COLHOFF placed them under arrest and the three Indian individuals were taken to the Rosebud Jail.

COLHOFF was informed by SA WILEY that the FBI has not arrested nor do they intend to charge the three Indian males with any Federal violation. COLHOFF stated that the three individuals would be charged with public intoxication. At 7:20 AM, COLHOFF assumed custody of the three Indian males.



Master Sergeant DON CLARK and Staff Sergeant GLEN ANDERSON, 28MMS, EOD, Ellsworth Air Force Base, telephone master 399-2018 or 2019, appeared at the residence of AL RUNNING, Grass Mountain, South Dakota. Materials found in the search of the residency out-buildings and tents of the AL RUNNING residence were displayed to these individuals for their processing relative to making explosive material safe.

These two individuals processed the following explosives devices:

1. Two (2) one pound sticks of Trojan brand dynamite with pull friction priming device with detonation cap. This firing device is described as having a wire from an orange object with approximately one half inch of orange fuse exposed and a blasting cap.

2. One (1) one pound stick of Trojan brand dynamite with pull friction prime device with blasting cap.

3. Five (5) bundles containing 28 one pound sticks of Trojan brand dynamite not primed. Bundles wrapped in newspaper, part tied with string, part with electrician's black tape.

4. Seven (7) railroad type torpedoes. These were described as devices placed on train tracks to sound an alarm or signal for individuals working on the tracks.

5. One (1) small carton containing Dupont brand blasting caps, no further identification. These caps measured approximately 1 1/2 in. length and a diameter of 3/8". The caps were silver cylinder shaped pieces of metal.

6. Eight (8) hand grenades. These grenades were, made from a dummy type training grenade, three of which had approximately one inch of safety fuse with cap attached. The remaining five had firing devices identical to that of the dynamite in item number one above.

CLARK and ANDERSCH removed, the priming device from the grenades, pulled a cork from the bottom and through the use of a probe in the bottom and top portion, of the grenade, removed powder of an unknown type and origin, and it was noted in addition to the powder, each grenade had beads, nuts and bolts and numerous rusty nails.

CLARK and ANDERSON removed the wrapper from one of the Trojan sticks of dynamite and retained the disarmed eight grenades for evidence. It should be noted all powders associated with these devices were described by CLARK and ANDERSON as being extremely unstable and too hazardous to retain and remove from the area.

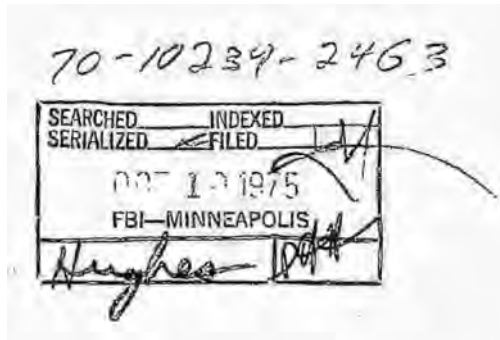

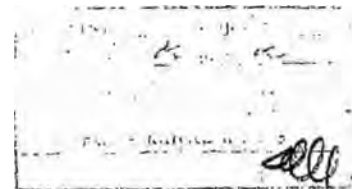

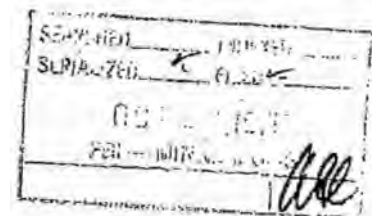
